Kansas City home sales rose at a solid pace last year, increasing by 8.5 percent.

Activity has tailed off somewhat this year, and sales are expected to end the year down just slightly at 28,920 units. Sales should be flat again next year, rising by just 1.9 percent to 29,470 units.

The rapid growth of single-family building permits has slowed this year as well.
Following two years of more than 30 percent growth, permitting activity this year is on pace to just equal last year. Next year permits should rise by a modest 2.3 percent to 4,300 units.
