Wichita State University's Center for Real Estate will present the 2023 Kansas Housing Markets Forecast at 10:15 a.m. Thursday, Oct. 6, at the Kansas Association of Realtors Annual Conference at the Marriott in Overland Park.

Stan Longhofer, director of WSU's Center for Real Estate, will present the forecast. He will be available for interviews after his presentation at about 11:30 a.m.

The 2023 Kansas Housing Forecast Series reviews current housing market conditions in the major markets across the state – including Kansas City, Lawrence, Manhattan, Topeka, and Wichita – and forecasts housing market activity through the end of 2023. The series also includes Housing Outlooks for 23 smaller markets across the state.
